## GUTHRIE COOPER

OBE, Mr. G.., C Eng. FICE OBE, B Sc., C Eng., FICEbetter known to his many as Guthrie Cooper, Re gional Director, Property Services Agency, German retired in December 973. Born in Dunbarton hire, educated at Edin burgh Academy and Glas ow University, after pupil , Guthrie Cooper joined the Air Ministry Works Dept. in 1939.
