## RECOGNIZE THIS?



Taken 32 years ago this was the main entrance to the JHQ complex in the summer of 1952. The photograph shows Colonel Grattan, Chie engineer of the building project, standing at the eastern end of what is now Queens Avenue near to the traffic lights on Hardter Straße Although this was the beginning of its modern military association the area has a long military pedigree. Indeed, during the excavation of the main JHQ building, a 5th century Frankish axe was found, which gave rise to the current NORTHAG badge. The complex took just over two years to complete, and replaced the previous separate sites of the Army and RAF HQs in Bad Oeynhausen and Bad Eilsen near Minden Other items found included a Cossack cutlass bearing the initial and crown of Alexander of Russia, who in 1813 sent a token force of 300 to assist Wellington against Napoleon. Somewhat earlier, the Duke of Marlborough billeted his army of 19000 redcoats in the forest during the march from the Maas to the seige of Bonn.

Earlier still, the village of Peel was mentioned in Roman records, its name, Paludus, being Latin for swamp! Just remember that when you are bitten by a Roman mosquito this summer!

JHQ and its transient population have been the guests of Stadt Mönchengladbach since 1954, and the 30th anniversary of this association is celebrated on the 21st June, a German public holiday The principal aim is to invite local German inhabitants to visit the JHQ area and to see and meet members of the military community. There will be a Volksmarsch over 5 or 10 kilometers; the Oberbürgermeister of Mönchergladbach will present an oak tree, several marquees will depict the nationalities which comprise the four headquarters, HO BAOR, RAFG, NORTHAG and 2 ATAF, and naturally there will be refreshment tents. An active programme of sporting fixtures and games will all contribute to what we hope will be a truly memorable day.

## Trinity Sunday - 17 June

The old story of the young Curate having difficulty in preaching on the Trinity. The Parisi Priest said to him: "I never havo any difficulty. I begin my sermon: Today is Trinity Sunday. If there is one thing the Trinity doesn't like it's stealing. Now about stealing ...."I It is difficult. It is the most fundamental mystery of Christian Faith. Three Persons in one God. Not three persons equal three Gods. But there is a danger in getting caught up in the numbers game and forgetting that the Trinity is abput God. And who is our God? Do we sometimes make God to our own image and likeness? Is he an old man with a beard, distant and remote beyond the clouds? Is he a Judge, easily offended, who watches all our actions, anxious to notice our failings and faults?
Trinity Sunday reminds us of the poverly of these images. It tells us that the God we believe in is overflowing with life, rich and vibrant life. Each of us participates in that life: in that community of life that is not turned in on itself. A poet in that life: in that community of life that is not turned in on itself. A poet impression he got was of separateness ". .. unrelatedness was the skin on every face".

Life in the Trinity is the opposite. It calls us to live not as solitary individuals but as a community. Life in the Trinity (our life in God) gives us a mission. That mission is to all those with whom we live and work. It is a mission of building a community, of living honestly and of struggling to be just.

## Birds in and around Rheindahlen

## Summer Visitors

This month we will discuss four of our Summer visitors who will, by now, be well on their way to rearing their new families before returning South for the Winter. The Wheatear, Redstart, Stonechat and White
spotted Bluethroat belong to the same general family as the more common Blackbird and Robin but tend to have more selective habitats; therefore, you are more likely to see them when you are out for a walk, rather than in your garden.

## Wheatear

The Wheatear is nearly half-an-inch larger than the Robin and spends the Winter in NorthAfrica. If you are on holiday around the Mediterranean then you should watch out for up to a dozen different species of Wheatear. The breeding male has a grey crown and back, white eye stripe and black cheeks; the breast is a warm buff colour fading to a pale belly and the wings are black. The most distinguishing feature, as with all Wheatears, is the black "T" on the tail which stands out against the white rump. They are normally seen in open country such a grassy downs and moorland. The german name for the Wheatear is Steinschmätzer.


## Redstart

The Redstart is the same size as the Robin and also spends its Winter in Africa. The male is a particularly attractive bird with its grey forehead mantle, white forehead, black throat and orange breast; but it is the firey chestnut tail which is often first noticed and from which it derives its name. The Redstart is usually seen in woodland and parks but its close relativethe Black Redstart is all black expect for white wingpatches and a similar rufous tail, and is also seen regularly in this area. The German name for Redstart is Gartenrotschwanz (Garden red tail) and the Black Redstart is Hausrotschwanz (House red tail).

## Stonechat

The Stonechat is half-an-inch shorter than the Robin and can usually be seen perched on weeds such as thistles on heathland or open farmland. This perky little bird spends its Winter just north of the Mediterranean and the male can easily be recognised in Summer with its black head and throat, chestnut breast, and dark back and wings; it has contrasting white patches on its neck, rump and wings. The German name for Stonechat is Schwarzkehichen and the Robin is a Rotkehichen.


## White-Spotted Bluethroat

The White-spotted Bluethroat is the same size as the Robin but is rather shy and is normally seen in swampy and marshy thickets by fresh water. The male is the most spectacular of the four species discussed here and in Summer the white spot stands out on the bright blue throat which is bordered by a black and red band on the breast. It also has a pale eyestripe and a rufous base to the tail. The Bluethroat is not often seen in UK, therefore it is worth making the effort to see it whilst in Germany or Holland. The German name for Bluethroat is Blaukehlchen.

## Where can we go today?

Krickenbecker Seen: illustrated on front cover
Less than half-an-hours drive from Rheindahlen is the Krickenbecker Seen nature reserve. This is an ideal spot for a family day-out and is approximately 5 kms South-East of Venlo. Four lakes surround Schloss Krickenbeck (which is not open to the public) and the lakes are set amongst mature woodland with odd stretches of marsh and reed beds.
There are numerous footpaths through the woods and around the lakes wherea good variety of birds can be seen throughout the year. Birds seen in the last few weeks have included Nightingale, Kingfisher, Great-Crested Grebe with young, Lesser-Spotted Woodpecker, Nuthatch, Short-toed Treecreeper and many Grey Heron. If you do not wish to walk you can always hire the German equivalent of a Tri-Shaw and pedal around the area in comfort
Other facilities include miniature golf, rowing boats, swimming pool, fishing and horse-riding. It almost goes without saying that there are several Gaststätte and Speise-Restaurants in the vicinity where you can get a cup of coffee and a cake, an ice cream, or a very substantial meal. The following have been sampled and can be recommended - Gaststätte Seehof, Hotel-Restaurant Strandbad, Secretis Speise-Restaurant, but our favourite is still the Gaststätte Restauran Leuther Mühle!

If you have not yet explored this 'Naturschutzgebiet' why not try it the next weekend you are wondering where to go, or even drop in on your way home after your next shopping trip to Venlo.

## Car Thefts, Theft from cars

The latest motto is "LOCK IT OR LOSE IT!IF IT'S WORTH KEEPING, LOCK IT UP! ${ }^{\text {" }}$
You leave your car possibly not for long, you think it will be safe enough and don't bother to lock it up. When you return there's an empty space where your car ought to be.

It's a shattering experience, particularly if your personal property has gone with it. You may be miles from home and stranded. It's almost as bad to find the car still there but valuable personal possessions gone Much better to lock the car always, not just when you think of it.
Useful advice when leaving your car:

1. Lock all doors and windows including quarter lights.
2. Always remove the ignition key when the car's not in use, even when its garaged.
3. Don't leave the car with valuables on view. Remove them, or at leas put them out of sight.
4. Never leave your car unattended with luggage on the roof rack.
5. If you have to leave anything in your car, the boot is the best place. But make sure you remember to lock it
6. When leaving your car at night, park in a well-lit-place.

Help the police to help you.
Your police force needs your help in beating crime. They can't do their job without it.
You can help best by reporting at once anything that strikes you as suspicious.
If you saw someone being attacked, or robbing a shop, you would, naturally, call the police. But ring them just the same if you see someone lurking around your neighbour's side door or trying car doors. The police won't mind if you're wrong: PREVENTION IS BETTER THAN CURE!

## Obscene Telephone calls

The number of obscene and nuisance telephone calls reported to the RMP is increasing and is giving serious cause for concern. Part of the problem is that they are extremely difficult to trace. The Bundespost will fit tracing devices to the subscribers phone, but only at a cost.
The receivers of these calls are mainly women on their own. These calls, when persistent, cause strain, stress and undoubtedly fear

The calls are received in different ways:

1. The caller who dials the number and hangs up as the phone is lifted.
2. The heavy breather who says nothing and hangs up after several seconds. 3. The obscene caller who uses obscene language and phrases
3. Finally, the threatening caller who threatens the receiver with acts of violence. What to do if you receive an obscene or nuisance call: hang up gently without showing emotion. In most cases the caller won't ring back. Make sure that children (or babysitters) answer the phone correctly, without innocently giving away private intormation such as: "Daddy is away on exercise and won't be back until ..."
If someone phones whilst you are out they should be asked to leave their number for you to ring back later, if you wish.
Ladies who have entries in the directory are advised to use only their initials, and not Miss or Mrs.
If nuisance calls persist, a change of number or going ex-directory may be warranted.
We hope this advice will help you if the situation ever arises.

## The Diary of Anne Frank

If you are reading this in the comfort of your own home then take careful note of the dimensions of the room in which you are sitting. Now discard the furniture and replace it with "basic", well-worn cheap chairs, a table and a tawdry bed-settee and find yourself incarcerated with two families with teenage children and an inflexible batchelor who will live with you indefinitely and you will begin to appreciate the conditions in which Anne Frank spend her formative teenage years.
To exacerbate the problems of living in very close confinement, there must be no movement or conversation during the working hours of the factory over which you live; the sitting room functions also as a bedroom and there is a constant fear of discovery
Such was the setting in which Anne Frank lived and wrote her diary, dramatised by Frances Goodrich and Albert Hackett, which was the Ariel Theatre Guild submission to this year's BFG Drama Festival.
For the production the Guild returned to the Main Theatre at Rheindahlen where the stage, lighting and sound effects were all used to their maximum advantage. Particularly pleasing was the clarity and accuracy of the sound effects which rendered a very authentic Dutchtown atmosphere of traffic, carilon and steam organ.
The cast were excellent with an outstanding performance by Wendy Grimmett who portrayed not only the young authoress but also the narrator. Her ability to "grow" on stage from a young 13 year old to a mature 15 was truly impressive.
This was a memorable production, excellent in every respect - cast, props and set. It soon became obvious that Ariel were inspired to honour the memory of Anne Frank and those who shared he horrendous experience. It would have been easy for the frequent periods of tension to have reduced the play to a melodrama but all was held firmly under control and the touches of humour and humanity which punctuated the script, effectively lowered the theatrical temperature. Let's go on a picnic and forget all those sandwiches! The Earl of Sandwich may have inspired the first sandwich, but I am sure that hunter's loaf was invented by a woman faced with the task of making scores of sandwiches. So here are a few suggestions for your 'Picnic Basket'.

## Hunter's Loat

1 French Stick $\quad 1$ tablespoon of chopped gherkins
$50 \mathrm{~g} / 2$ ozs butter
1-2 teaspoons of made mustard
2 tablespoons tomato ketchup
(or other savoury sauce)

1-2 tablespoons chopped spring onions or chives
$350 \mathrm{~g} / 12$ ozs liver sauce or cooked ham
(The ingredients can be varied according to taste)

Cut both ends off the French loaf and scoop out all the fresh crumb. This is not as difficult as it sounds but it does require a little patience. If the French loaf is very long cut it in two pieces. Cream the butter with 1-2 teaspoons of made mustard and tomato ketchup. Add the chopped gherkins, spring onions or chives. Gradually mix with the liver sausage or cooked ham. Split the loaf lengthways and spread with butter and filling. It is best made the night before. Wrap in tin foil and chill overnight. Just before leaving for your picnic, cut into slices and re-wrap in foil for transportation. Pack a few pickled cucumbers to eat with it -or some crunchy celery stalks.

## Stuffed Eggs

6 hard-boiled eggs 1 teaspoon French mustard
$75 \mathrm{~g} / 3$ ozs butter
a little cream
pinch salt, pepper, paprika
chopped chives
a dash of wine vinegar
Halve the eggs, scoop out the yolks. Cream the butter with salt, pepper and paprika. Beat in the egg yolks and the French mustard. Add a dash of wine vinegar and just enough cream to give a thick smooth consistency. Taste and adjust seasoning if necessary. Pile the mixture into the halved whites and set them side by side in a container. Sprinkle with plenty of chopped chives. Cover container with a lid or foil and leave to chill until required.

## Herby Beef Loaf - Serves 4-6

$1 \mathrm{~kg} / 2 \mathrm{lbs}$ Minced beef
1 tablespoon chopped chives
$1 / 2 \mathrm{~kg} / 1 \mathrm{lb}$ pork sausagemeat
1 cup of fresh white breadcrumbs
1 onion finely chopped
1 tablespoon chopped parsley

1/2 tablespoon fresh or dried sage 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce salt and freshly milled pepper 2 eggs beaten

Mix all the ingredients together and bind with the beaten eggs. Turn this into a well-greased 2 lb loaf tin and cover with foil. Now put the tin into a larger baking tin or dish, which contains about an inch of cold water. Bake in a moderate oven, Gas mark $4,180^{\circ}$, for $11 / 2$ hours.
Either turn out and serve hot with a tomato sauce or allow it to cool in the tin, turn out and serve with thick mayonnaise. This meat loaf freezes very well.
The next recipe is quite delicious if you like anything curried. It is best made the night before in order to let the ingredients infuse.

## Curried Rice with Mango Chutney

$275 \mathrm{~g} / 10$ ozs rice
1 onion (chopped finely)

```
2 dessertspoons curry powder (to taste)
1-2 teaspoons curry powder (to taste)
1 banana (optional)
```

Boil the rice. Wait until the rice has cooled and then add the ingredients together. Put in an airtight container and store in the refrigerator until required.

## Chocolate Fruit Fingers

$\begin{array}{ll}100 \mathrm{~g} / 4 \mathrm{ozs} \text { plain flour } & 50 \mathrm{~g} / 2 \mathrm{ozs} \text { plain chocolate } \\ 100 \mathrm{~g} / 4 \text { ozs caster sugar } & 50 \mathrm{~g} / 2 \text { ozs raisins }\end{array}$
$100 \mathrm{~g} / 4$ ozs butter or margarine
2 eggs
a few drops of vanilla essence

## $50 \mathrm{~g} / 2$ ozs raisins

$50 \mathrm{~g} / 2 \mathrm{ozs}$ chopped walnuts or peanuts
or cherries
a sprinkling of caster sugar

Beat the butter or margarine to a soft cream. Add the caster sugar and continue beating until the mixture is soft and light. Sift the flour. Break the eggs one at a time in a cup to make sure they are fresh. Then beat them well together. Add a little of the egg at a time to the creamed mixture, beating well after each addition. Stir in the vanilla essence, the flour and the melted chocolate. Finally add the chopped nuts and raisins (or cherries) and stir them evenly through the mixture. Bake in a moderately hot oven about Gas Mark 4,375 F, $180^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ for 35 minutes or until it is cooked. Turn onto a wire tray to cool. Cut into 12 fingers when it is cold and sprinkle with caster sugar. These fingers keep very well in an airtight tin.

## IN VIEW - IN VIEW - IN VIEW - IN VIEW

I hardly need to review the first film of the month. Whatever I say the fans will rush to see the new James Bond film Never say never again. I should of course say one of the new James Bonds films since last year saw the arrival of twol Given the choice this month's has to be preferred to Octopussy, for the simple reason that it has Sean Connery as Bond. The Roger Moore Bond films are sheer absurd fun but Connery some how manages to inject some reality into the action and make a person of our superhero.

Another big draw at the box office is the impassive Mr. Eastwood. A pity that his latest offering Sudden impact should be more noteworthy for violence and cynicism than for acting or plot!

Yet another male superstar, (whatever happened to female superstars?) David Bowie, makes a reappearance this month. Bowie has never been afraid of unusual or difficult subjects and Merry Christmas Mr Lawrence is no exception. Set in a Japanese POW camp this film is distinguished from the common run by the fact that it has a Japanese director, NAGISA OSHIMA, and a British producer; and the cast is led by two rock stars from East and West, an English actor and a Japanese comedian. The film is a genuine and partly successful attempt to explain the Japanese to the world and vice versa through the story of the clash between two radically different cultures. Not a perfect film but a very interesting one.

Among the other new films this morith, Krull is a sort of Sci Fi Fairy tale which is mainly notable for a plethora of special effects. Trading Places is a splendid American comedy based on the simple idea of a bet between two eldery money men that they can make a financial genius out of a bum and push a man with all the advantages into the gutter. The brilliant Eddie Murphy is the bum who becomes the sharp Wall Street man and Dan Ackroyd is the self satisfied Ivy Leaguer who comes down to earth hard. An excellent supporting role from Denholm Elliott as the butler who has a rather surprising change of masters! Scarface is an overlong and very violent gangster film but it is also full of talent and tension.

We have done well for new films this month, over half are fairly recent and new to Rheindahlen. But of course repeats are not always a bad thing, not when they give the opportunity to catch up with, or even see again, films of the cailibre of Educating Rita and Local Hero. Apart from being two of the films I most enjoyed last year, these are two films which show the excellence of the British film industry (when it can find any moneyl). Educating Rita is a sort of modern day "Pygmalion" with Julie Walters as the working class girl who decides to improve her mind instead of doing what family and friends want, settling down and having kids. It is a very funny film but also a sharp and bitter one. No romantic views of working class solidarity here! Local Hero, also a comedy, tells of an American Oil company's attempt to buy a chunk of Scottish coastline and the local determination to make as much out of the deal as possible. It is humorous (once you can cope with the accents!) and beautifully cast; and even so simple a plot can have some marvellous twists to it! Repeat or not it is certainly my film of the month!
